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PRESENTATION(S):

<u>Sacramento Transportation Authority – Presentation of Measure B</u>

<u>Presenters</u>: Jeffrey Spencer – Executive Director, Sacramento Transportation Authority Michael Penrose – Director, Department of Transportation, County of Sacramento Todd Smith described the history of Measure B and the request for Sacramento County Department of Transportation's draft 5-year plan for maintenance projects that was presented to the Board of Supervisors on June 8, 2016. The Board of Supervisors requested a **draft plan** for the first five years of Measure B implementation, if Measure B is passed by the voters. This draft plan was not formally adopted by the Board.

The presenters explained the history of Measure A which passed by the voters in 2004 and added a ½ cent sales tax for the county; it has been extended till 2039. Measure A was or capital improvements for transportation needs. Measure B is for maintenance of the transportation system (roadways, bus, light rail, pedestrian and bicycle transportation). The added tax is once again a ½ cent increase in the sale tax and it will continue until 2047. Unique to the Measure B agenda is for the first 5 years, 75% of the generated revenue will be used for "Fix It First". The prioritization the projects to be fixed first is based upon the Pavement Condition Index (PCI) where the index of -0- is a failed roadway and the index of 100 is a new roadway. The presenters noted that when the PCI reaches an index of 65 the decline of the roadway is accelerated necessitating a more urgent fix.

ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC VOICED CONCERN THAT THE PURPOSE AND COMMITMENT OF THE FUNDS FOR MEASURE B BE CONSISTENTLY APPLIED OVER THE 30 YEAR TERM OF THE TAX. CONCERN WAS RAISED REGARDING A NEW BRIDGE ACROSS THE AMERICAN RIVER AT DISCOVERY PARK. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DO NOT HAVE JURISDICTION IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO.
