2. Planning Item: PLNP2019-00124 - Oxbow Wireless Communication Facility.

Discussion:

Applicant presented their proposal to use an existing monopole as a permanent cell facility. Applicant explained that PG&E had de-commissioned a previous tower. This negatively impacted Sprint who subsequently put up a temporary tower. This proposal makes the temporary tower permanent.

Council asked if equipment from prior site was going to be moved also. Applicant said, yes and that the equipment would be fenced as was displayed in materials.

- III. Staff Update Tim Hawkins
 - 1. Planning has been directed to re-work their proposed CPAC amendments. The proposed changes are slated for reconsideration by the Board of Supervisors sometime late in first quarter 2020.
 - 2. Gil Labrie said he had talked with Supervisor Nottoli about bringing all his Councils' Chairs in for a meeting to discuss issues especially related to rural groups. He reiterated that Planning should focus on CPACs with problems and not use a broad brush to change all the Advisory Councils. Supervisor Serna had made the comment that there are many ways and areas that the County can streamline processes to meet the State's new "5 meetings" rule requirement. Asked that Council get the changes in advance. Hawkins suggested that Gil keep in touch with the County's senior staff handling the proposal.
 - 3. Hawkins -- Update on "Dog Food Factory" matter It was being heard tonight by the Agriculture Commission. If Ag Comm recommends cancellation of the Williamson Act, then the item goes to the Board of Supervisors. If the Williamson Act is cancelled, then they could go forward with a use permit and then the matter would make its way to DCMAC.
 - 4. New Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Law
 - a. Gil Labrie/Sally Shanks asked: how will the new law effect the SPA's (Special Planning Areas)? Do we need to amend the SPAs? Does the ADU compromise the SPAs? Concerns were raised about West Walnut Grove not being in a SPA. Does the 5 meetings rule apply to ADU?
 - b. Topper If an existing resident is at grade, can the ADU be built at grade? Or, does it need to be raised as FEMA dictates?

Motion To: Continue ADU discussion. Motion By: Eddy Motion 2nd By: Schauer Vote: Ayes = 10. Noes = 0. Abstains = 0.

5. Brown Act & DCMAC – Council members raised questions regarding discussion of items. Dabrie questioned whether Brown Act applies to DCMAC, since it is a community discussion forum, suggesting there was latitude for DCMAC. He contended that it is up to the Board of Supervisors.
