PRESENTATION:

1. **OAK AVENUE TRAIL**

The proposed Oak Avenue Trail System project is to construct a multi-purpose trail system within the existing community and road structure of the northern portion of Orangevale, County of Sacramento and a small portion of Placer County. This trail would provide area citizens and visitors with a safe and healthy multi-use

corridor. This trail connects parks, schools, transit, library, county buildings, and commercial centers within an attractive and friendly environment.

The Oak Avenue Trail System (OATS) shall:

- Provide a multi-purpose trail from Placer County trailhead to the Orangevale Community Park;
- Retain and enhance the rural character of the community;
- Improve local traffic issues;
- Allow the community citizens and visitors to safely utilize the area by walking, on horse back, and by bicycle;
- Improve the appearance of the area by adding landscaping features and trees.

The main trail of OATS is approximately 2.1 miles in length and would provide a multi-purpose trail that connects with the existing Dry Creek Parkway trail at the Placer County line and Santa Juanita Avenue. The trail parallels Santa Juanita Avenue (on the west side) from the Placer County line, turns west at Oak Avenue and proceeds along Oak (on the north side) until connecting with Casa Roble High School (CRHS) and eventually, the Orangevale Equestrian Center pathway, which is located within the Orangevale Community Park (Oak and Filbert Avenues). The trail will cross Oak Avenue at the Filbert intersection with the aid of a pedestrian activated signal.

A formal traffic roundabout will be constructed at the intersection of Oak and Santa Juanita Avenues. This will help slow the motorized traffic as it enters the OATS region and provide a visual entrance to the area. A short trail from this intersection paralleling Oak Avenue on the south side will connect to the local business center located approximately ¼ mile east of the intersection.
